In this section, background information is provided, as well as detailed lesson plans. A stepby-step approach is given, containing a list of pre- and post-reading activities, general, specific and prediction questions, ideas for projects, posters and games, etc., to encourage class participation and discussions. Revision Tests and a detailed marking scheme are also included.
- Student's Digital Material, which contains a fully dramatised version of the story, including music and sound effects, makes reading more pleasurable and is also useful for listening practice before learners read the text.
- Packs, which include the Student's Book, the Activity Book and the accompanying audio, are also available.
